

It is anticipated that the commission will be able to solicit enough funding to carry out the working group activities.

After the discussion, the group presented arrangements by assigning group leaders to each discipline suggested as depicted in the following Table.



They are: Prof. R. Kebesy, Prof. R. Durrhiem, Prof. M. Meghraoui, Dr. Abuo El-Ela and




Dr. Assia Harbi.

On action item which could not be solved was: Where to open a Bank account for the AfSC in order to accrue any financial support that comes to the AfSC. (AfSC executive to discuss & conclude) AfSC executive to decide on bank account	
2. <u>Election</u>	
The election issue was a very contentious one during the panel discussion.	
One group of the panel argued that election of the EC should be conducted during the 1st AfSC Assembly as it is a customary practice. The other group	



argued that nominations and lobbing potential EC members for the new office should be conducted ahead of the Assemblies which was not the case. This latter argument was also supported by the IASPEI Secretary General. In addition according to minutes of the first meeting held in Johannesburg (Date?), a decision was made by everyone present that the next elections should be held at the 2018 2 nd General Assembly. Finally, agreement was reached for the current EC members to continue and make preparations to conduct elections during the 2nd General Assembly to be held in 2018. In line with this agreement, a group of four people with good geographical representation was nominated and tasked with coordinating the nomination of new office bearers ahead of the 2018 2 nd General Assembly. Prof. R. Durrheim (Chair) from South Africa, Mrs. G. Keanji from Kenya, Dr. H. Assia from Algeria, and Dr. S. Bonazis from Tunisia. 3. Venue of 2 nd AfSC Assembly It was suggested and agreed that the 2 nd General Assembly should be held in a different African country. Morocco and Kenya suggested hosting but they were told that they will have to come up and submit proposals once bids are opened. It was agreed that bids will be open until April 2017. It is a customary practice in the unions and associations to determine the next host country once every general assembly is concluded. So this time it was suggested that we nominate two hosts consecutively that can host the 2018 and 2020 AfSC assemblies.	Invitations to bid for the general assemblies in 2018 and 2020 shall be sent out to members and closed in April 2017




4. <u>AfSC Secretariat Office</u>
